ACTIVITY: Create your own Mandala

Mandala means 'circle'. Mandalas were first created by the Buddhist monks around 560 BC. That's 2,580 years ago! A mandala is a symmetrical circle. Mandalas can use different colors/objects, but they all have something in common: RADIAL SYMMETRY.

Mandala art begins with a central point and all other lines/colors/shapes/symbols radiate out from that central place. This means it is a patterned circle that looks the same all the way around!

A Mandala is defined as a circular design of the universe and also as a symbol expressing a person's striving for unity of the self. Making a mandala is a calming and meditative process, a great activity in this anxious time!

How to create a Nature Mandala:

1. Go outside (make sure to get an adults permission) and collect items in a container to be part

of your mandala (flowers, rocks, grass, leaves, etc.). If you cannot go outside - make use of the objects you have inside

2. Arrange these items in a circle pattern.

3. If you are able to, snap a photo
