Science with Mrs. M-B

Y7s recently completed their first dissection. Dissections can be a challenging activity, but the Y7s handled their prawns with maturity and strong stomachs. This dissection was an opportunity to connect learning on Phylum Arthropoda, one of the 9 major phyla of Kingdom Animalia, to marine life around Zanzibar. Among the animal phyla that we studied, we also talked about Phylum Porifera which includes sponges.

On this topic, we were able to explore how sponges are being cultivated as an alternate revenue source for Zanzibari people living on the East coast. This week marks the end of Y7's Kingdom Animalia studies. A new term brings a new area of study and the students will be moving on to Chemistry topics.


Scholastic Book Orders

It has been a fun week in Science for the Year 8's and 9's. We had our last lesson on the topic of pollination, wrapping it up with a flower dissection. Each student had to find at least two different types of flower, many chose Hibiscus and Frangipani. This choice happened to be perfect since their structures are very different. First the students were 'let loose' to dissect the flowers in any way they wanted to try to find and identify the various parts. Once they had done this, we watched a video of a "professional" doing the dissection. We repeated the activity and worked out how to separate and identify each part precisely.
